

I had the strangest thing happen this morning. I brought in a new candle for my office at Highland and it has totally melted! It was like a blob in the jar! I can't even find the wick! It's totally changed and I'm not even sure it's useful anymore.

Over the last week, while I was on study leave, some of the reading I did concerned the post-COVID church. Whether we all realize it or not, like my poor candle, we have been changed by the last 18 months. Some things will go back to 'normal,' others will become a new normal. (Still not sure what the new normal will be for my candle!)

One of the most important things we may have learned in this time is the reminder that THE CHURCH is not the physical building where we gather for worship and other church activities. THE CHURCH IS THE PEOPLE. We were as much the church during the height of this pandemic as always. In fact, in some ways I believe we may have been more like the church than ever. In being given the opportunity to slow down we had a chance to re-center. Our focus shifted to others. We called, sent cards, dropped gifts on door steps. We were filled with gratitude for those that we often overlook or take for granted. In each and every one of those acts WE WERE THE CHURCH even if we weren't in the building.

How has our attitude toward our church buildings changed in light of this? Our buildings are special, valuable and important to us. We are grateful for them – but they are not the church! WE ARE THE CHURCH.

THINK ABOUT THIS: Our church buildings are a tool, that God has provided for us to use in the proclamation of God's love and compassion. Our buildings are the opportunity God has given us to be a place where people gather, not just for worship, Sunday School, meetings. Our buildings can be places where kids gather to hear stories read, where neighborhood kids can come for some summer fun. They are places where exercise classes meet, where folks gather for breakfast or come play on the playground or eat turkey.

HOW CAN OUR BUILDINGS CONTINUE TO BE USED to be a blessing to our community? When people look at our buildings will they comment on the love, the fellowship, the caring that the building represents? Or will they have not even noticed us?

We have learned that we can be the church even when we're not in our building. But our buildings can help us be the church for our communities. I'm not sure where this will lead us, just like I'm not sure what to do with my candle. But this I do know, God is working through our churches – I see exciting things happening as our churches reach out into the community and into the world.

What's next for my candle? I have no clue. What's next for our churches? God knows. Thanks be to God.
