Let's worship! Let's pray! Let's serve!

While I was growing up in a small Presbyterian congregation in New Jersey, I never heard about Advent or Lent. For some reason my Pastor didn't teach us about things like that. It was when I got to seminary that I was clued into the amazing, dramatic and hopeful story of God's salvation story. It is a story of love, forgiveness and hope. When we walk into that story and claim it as our own it truly changes us.

Of course, the first part of the story begins with Advent. The celebration of the arrival of Emmanuel. The astounding good news that God has come to be with us. To show us firsthand, how to live as God's people. We then moved into the season of Epiphany – the ah-ha moments of discovering who Jesus is and how we are called to live in God's kingdom NOW – not only after we die.

Beginning March 2, we begin the season of Lent. Lent is a very different season than Advent, but every bit as miraculous and hopeful. Yes, hopeful! In walking with Jesus to his trial and death, he bears witness to the lengths that God has gone to FOR US!

The season of Lent becomes for us the story of love so amazing that it would give all for us. It's hard in some ways to walk through all that happens to Jesus as we walk with him to Calvary – there is something deep within us that wants to avoid – the betrayal, the loneliness and the pain. But it is worth the walk..because we know what comes at the end: Life! Resurrection! Wholeness!

You'll notice, by the sheer size of this newsletter that there is a lot going on the next few weeks as we focus on worship, prayer, study and service. It all begins on March 2nd Ash Wednesday. Our service that evening will be via zoom at 7pm. Participants from both churches will lead us through this special service. See details throughout the newsletter.

March 5th is the start of our Lenten Bible study, based on the book "The 24 Hours that Changed the World." The schedule is included in the newsletter. Then on March 6th, we again, journey back to Israel, and walk with Jesus through the last 24 hours of his life. Each Sunday we will be using the Lenten Wreath to help us walk through this season, and we will visit, via video, places like the upper room, the Garden of Gethsemane, Pilate's palace and so on. Again, there are lots of details throughout the newsletter.

Also during Lent, both churches will be collecting items for hygiene kits for church world service. Just imagine being flooded out, burned out of your home. Day after day, you have no toothbrush, deodorant, shampoo and so on. Christian World Service (CWS) distributes these hygiene bags to folks touched by natural disaster. The complete list is in the newsletter and in the bulletin. Please join us for this very special season, as we continue the story of God's love for us.

EXPAND OUR OUTREACH: This Season of COVID has given us an opportunity to re-think Church... to expand our outreach, and touch people weekly whom we might never have seen otherwise. Both congregations have benefited from the expansion of our worship into the virtual world... and people have enjoyed our services, both online, and in recorded format. We now distribute 4 recordings of the service each week to those who cannot access the Zoom; 2 audio recordings, and 2 video recordings. Our Zooms reach 20 to 30 people each week, some shut ins, some in nursing facilities, some snow birds, some who have moved states away, and some who just got up too late to make it to worship!

We have been enriched through our electronic presence, not separated by distance or circumstance. The Shared Ministry is committed to maintaining this, but in order to continue this vital ministry outreach, we are looking for folks who can assist by running the Zooms for Adult Sunday School and Worship at Highland one Sunday a month. Folks from both churches are encouraged to accept this sharing of time and talent. And the training is FREE! Right now, the search is on for 3 individuals... if you want to help, or ask questions, please contact Pastor Nancy.

The Deacons of both Shared Ministry Churches have chosen to focus our Lenten Mission Project on creating hygiene bags for Church World Service.

Imagine suddenly having to leave your home that has burned down or been wiped out by flooding. You would have nothing but the clothes on your back: no toothbrush, soap, washcloths, combs...it wouldn't take long before you would feel really 'gross.'

Hygiene bags provide some of these basic needs to folks who have been displaced from their homes. You can donate individual items or a whole hygiene bag if you would like. PLEASE FOLLOW THE LIST CAREFULLY as they are very specific as to what they can use.

SUPPLIES NEEDED:

- *One hand towel measuring approximately 15" x 28" to 16" x 32" (No fingertip, bath, dish, or micro-fiber towels.)
- *One washcloth
- *One wide-tooth comb removed from the package (Found at discount dealers like sallybeauty.com.) • *Must be sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth. No pocket combs or picks • Rattail and combs without handles are acceptable
- *One fingernail or toenail clipper (Either one is acceptable. Remove from packaging.)
- * One bath size bar of soap in the original package
- *One toothbrush in the original package
- *Ten standard size Band-Aids

Do not add any extra items or toothpaste. A tube of extended expiration date toothpaste will be added to each hygiene kit just prior to its journey.
